The Impact and Implications of the Covid-19 Pandemic

Some of you are overloaded with information and don't want to read anything more. That is fine. However, we realise that some RLBC folk are stuck at home and have time on their hands to think more about the impact of Covid-19 on the church. For those interested here are two free resources that you may find stimulating. They both have different contexts - Operation World is primarily concerned with global mission and CPAS has the Anglican church in its sights - and therefore we may not agree with everything and think things are slightly different in our situation. Nevertheless they are both very helpful.

1. Jason Mandryk, one of the authors of Operation World, published a short eBook a couple of weeks ago entitled *Global Transmission*, *Global Mission: The Impact and Implications of the Covid-19 Pandemic*. Mandryk explores the possible ramifications of the pandemic for church and mission. It is a sobering and thought-provoking read. At a time when many of us are understanding that this current crisis is not just something to get-over but a transition into a new era, it is a welcome contribution. He suggests that, "There is no return to normal because whatever we had before was not normal. There are parts of our old ways that we shouldn't want to go back to! There are also real opportunities to use the current upheaval to bring about positive change to our lives, our communities, and our societies.
